

## Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The bible readings for the Fourteenth Sunday are a call to listen to God and follow Him, even when those around us do not. In the first reading the prophet is sent but knows that the people might not listen. And in the gospel Jesus is rejected by the people in his hometown. But, both, the prophet and Jesus never stopped but continued their mission. Thus, this Sunday makes us think of how we can persist as disciples in times of adversity and how to handle rejection. Moreover, today is Independence Day in the United States. On this day, commonly called The Fourth of July, we celebrate the signing of the Declaration of Independence. So, by all means take time today to thank God for the freedom we have in this country. But, at the same time, let us consider the freedom Christ has given us to approach God with deep confidence. ## Feast of the Seven Holy Brothers—July 10

(The Seven Holy Brothers were executed under Marcus Aurelius for refusing to renounce the Faith. Their mother, Saint Felicity, said, “My children will live in eternal happiness if they die for Christ’s sake; should they, however, sacrifice to your gods, who are only devils, everlasting death will be their lot.” Saint Felicity was beheaded four months later.)

Christian parents! The salvation or the damnation of your children depends mostly on your conduct, on your instructions, on your discourses. If they see that your conduct is not according to the laws of God and the Church, if they hear from your mouth nothing but lies, slander, unchaste or blasphemous words, if you speak to them more of worldly pleasures than of God and of virtue; how shall they become acquainted with the true spirit of Christianity, how shall they learn how to save their souls? Oh! be watchful of your conduct and your discourse, if you wish to bring up your children as servants of the Most High, as future inhabitants of heaven.

How happy were the sons who possess so holy a mother! But what would have availed their mother’s sanctity to them, if they had not followed her admonitions and commands?

Christian children! If God has blessed you with parents who are solicitous for your salvation, give thanks to them, pray for them, and receive their instructions and reproofs willingly and obediently, that one day you may rejoice with them for all eternity in heaven. How many children may there be in hell who ceaselessly curse their parents for having allowed them too much liberty, for not having punished their faults, for not having kept them in the right path, or who even misled them to do evil by their discourse and example, and thus became the cause of their eternal ruin.

Baptism: Spanish baptism classes are held on the second Sunday of each month at 6:00pm.


